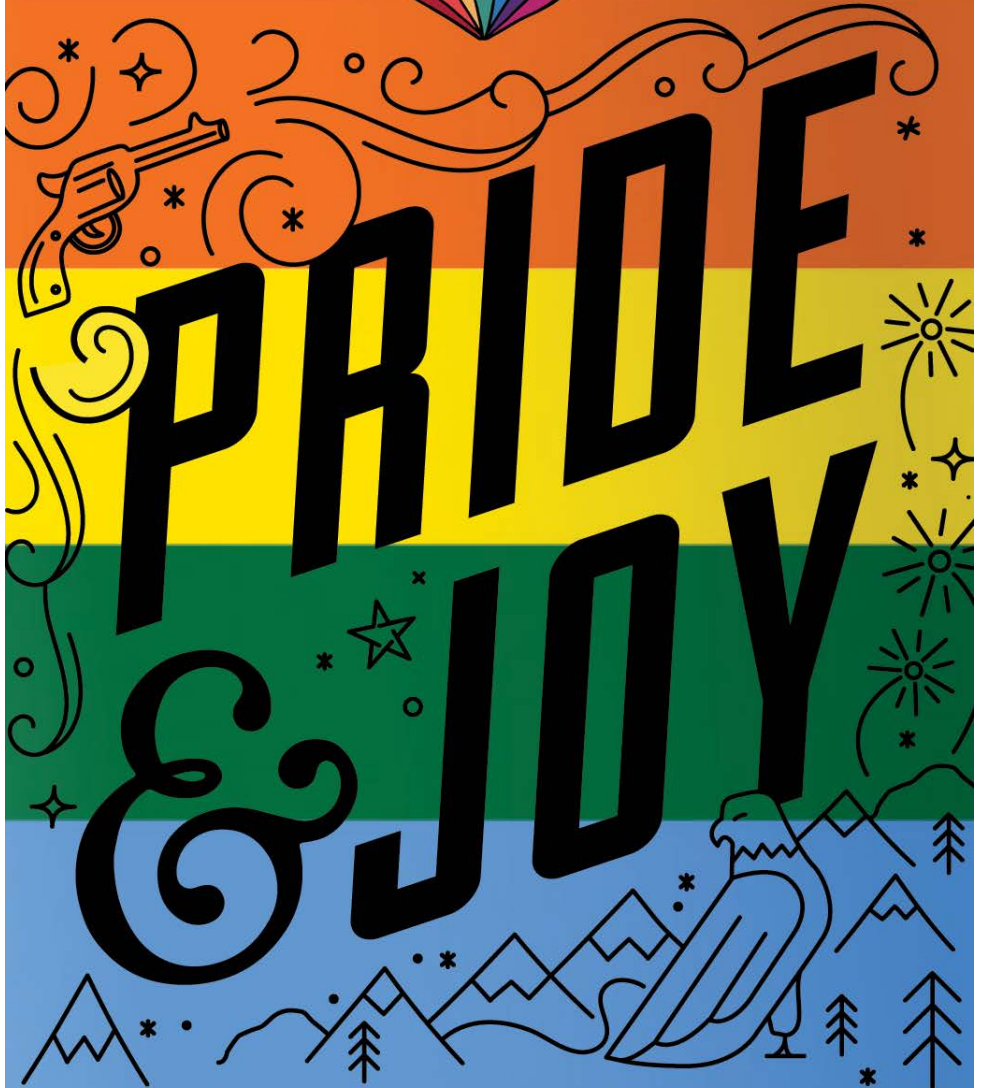

What should schools teach pupils about sex?

Join Happy Valley Pride's Patron Peter Tatchell for a discussion about the LGBT+ topic of the moment.

Millions of young people enter adulthood emotionally and sexually illiterate. Many subsequently endure disordered relationships, ranging from unfulfilling to outright abusive. The result? Much unhappiness - and sometimes mental and physical ill health. The lack of effective relationship and sex education (RSE) in many schools is part of the problem. It is often vague and euphemistic.

Schools should teach that heterosexuality, homosexuality and bisexuality are equally valid. The aim should be to ensure that pupils leave school emotionally and sexually literate and are able to enjoy fulfilling, enduring relationships.

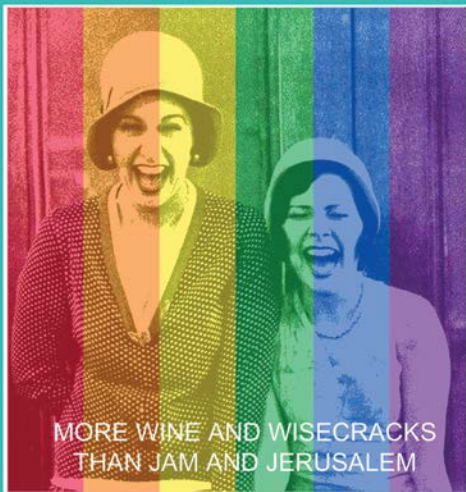
